

2024/2025 Curbside Garbage and Recycling Collection - 108 Mile Ranch

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Garbage is collected every week on Wednesday or Thursday. Recycling is collected every other week on Wednesday or Thursday. See the map and calendar on the back of this flyer for a recycling calendar.

Please note: Garbage-only pick up on Wednesday, December 25 will be moved to Friday, December 27. Garbage and Recycling pick-up scheduled for Wednesday, January 1st will move to Friday, January 3.



On **Thursday** recycling days from September through November garbage will be collected in the morning and recycling in the afternoon. This will reduce the opportunities for bears to access garbage. For the rest of the year recycling will be picked up *first* on Thursdays. Wednesday collection will always start with garbage. For additional bear aware tips, go to wildsafebc.com/black-bear

Totes should be at the curb by 7:30 a.m. Do not place totes out the night before.

Keep Out Contamination













Refer to your **108 Mile Recycling Guide** for what can and cannot be recycled. Download at <u>cariboord.ca</u> or request a copy: <u>talktrash@cariboord.ca</u> or 1-800-665-1636.

Keep these common items <u>OUT</u> of your curbside recycling:

- Plastic Bags all, including water softener and wood pellet
- **Glass** including ceramics
- <u>Styrofoam</u> including foam egg cartons and meat trays
- Plastic toys, rubber balls, Rubbermaid and Tupperware items – even if they have a recycling symbol
- Footwear, appliances, electronics, batteries, frying pans, utensils, scrap metal and wood – none of these are accepted items. The South Cariboo Recycling Guide has more information on recycling these materials.

Random curbside audits will continue this year to keep contamination rates in check.

Did You Know? Milk and milk substitute containers have a 10¢ deposit, return for refund with your other deposit beverage containers.



In 2023, over 96 tonnes of packaging and printed paper recyclables were diverted from the landfill!



Curbside Instructions

- 1. Have your totes at the curb by 7:30 a.m. On recycling days, they may need to be left out until 5 p.m.
- 2. Place your totes so that the lid opens towards the street.
- 3. Place totes at least one metre apart, or on either side of your driveway, on level ground away from vehicles and other obstacles.
- 4. Ensure tote lids are closed.
- 5. Place all items inside the totes.



108 MILE HOUSE WATERING RESTRICTIONS MAY 1 TO OCTOBER 1

B.C. is experiencing historic drought conditions, which are impacting residents, farmers, businesses, and wildlife. In an effort to conserve water, the Cariboo Regional District (CRD) has expanded the current water sprinkling restrictions for the 108 Mile Ranch water system. Please note, EVEN numbered premises may only water on EVEN numbered days of the month, ODD numbered premises may only water on ODD numbered days of the month. The use of yard sprinklers is allowed from 6:00 am to 8:00 am and 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

Water Saving Tips

During dry periods, your lawn and garden will need about 2 cm of water PER WEEK. Place an empty tuna can at different distances from your sprinkler. Time how long it takes to collect a full can of water. Water this length of time once per week in the summer. Reduce that time by half for spring and fall.

Don't run the hose while washing your car. Clean the car with a pail of soapy water. Use the hose only to rinse it off.

Check for leaks in pipes, hoses, faucets, and couplings. Leaks outside the house may not seem as bad, since they are not as visible. But they can be just as wasteful as a leak inside.

Use a broom to sweep driveways and sidewalks instead of a hose.


Cut your grass at a higher level to provide shade for the roots. Set your lawn mower blade between 5 and 8 cm and leave the grass cuttings on the lawn as mulch. The mulch slows the evaporation of water from the soil and acts as fertilizer. If your lawn fades in the summer, do not panic. Grass becomes naturally dormant during hot, dry periods. It will revive quickly after a good rainfall or when the weather becomes cooler.

Advise your children not to play with the hose and sprinklers. Consider filling up a pool.

Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants. Mulch will slow evaporation of moisture and discourage weeds from growing.

Register to receive emergency updates at your fingertips

Don't wait to hear about it from a friend or find out on Facebook. You can sign up for the Cariboo Chilcotin Emergency Notification System to receive emergency alerts immediately to a device of your choice. Whether it is a sudden loss of water supply, evacuation alert, or another type of emergency situation impacting you, we want to be able to notify you right away.

When there is an emergency, we will issue an alert through our notification system, website, email newsletters, and social media accounts. While we aim to post notices in your community or go door to door, this is not always possible. It is important that you are registered for the Emergency Notification System and the CRD's emergency emails.

Cariboo Chilcotin Emergency Notification System

By signing up, we can notify you if you are impacted by an evacuation alert, order, or a water service disruption. You can also download the Voyent Alert app through Google Play or the App Store to receive notifications directly to your mobile device.

If you are already registered, you can log in to manage and update your information.

Emergency Emails

To sign up for emails from the CRD, visit <u>cariboord.ca/subscribe</u>. Fill in your email address and select the water or sewer utility that applies to you. You can also sign up for other CRD updates, if you like, such as news and board meeting highlights.
